In 1995 Caring for China's Orphans was founded by Jeannie and Tim Butler after the adoption of their middle child Haley. The Butlers were among the first families in Nashville to brave the challenges of adopting internationally from China. It was a decision that forever changed their lives beyond the growth of their family. They have assisted in the care of over a thousand children living in Chinese orphanages from basic needs to supporting complex surgeries to putting many through high school and college. Jeannie has made 42 trips to China to deliver supplies, take on building projects, be hands on in surgical recovery, offer daily care for the children and even was an honored guest at the wedding of one of the children she watched grow up in one of CFCO's partner orphanages. On the Ground in Nigeria THIS IS ONLY THE BEGINNING

In 2022 we began working with a *Christian pastor named Brother Crown*, a Nigerian native, to fill basic needs to those in his community. These are the things many of us take for granted, yet, they are simple needs for many people all around the world. Brother Crown's introduction came just as Caring for China's Orphans began the task of expanding beyond orphan care to supporting families and widows who have found themselves in dire circumstances. He is a pastor studying the Bible through Harding University and he joyfully accepted the invitation to work with us in Nigeria.

At the time we connected with him we were contacted by a longtime supporter who works with another non-profit getting pillowcase dresses to children in another equatorial nation. Due to civil unrest in that nation, they have been unable to coordinate the delivery of the dresses. Hearing of our work, they donated a substantial number of dresses to us and we were able to deliver them to Brother Crown for distribution in Nigeria! The dresses came at the perfect time. In the process of changing our name to SOWN, the gift of hand-sewn dresses for distribution in Nigeria could not have been a better reflection of our work as well.

From assisting in the cost of medical bills, delivering nutritional support such as bags of rice to those with food insecurity, delivering boxes of diapers to orphanages...he is working with us to deliver assistance to people in the areas he is able to reach.

We are not sure what the future hold for us in regards to Nigeria, but we are truly grateful to be able to serve orphans and widows and share our love.
